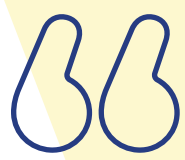

A recent survey found that specialty doctors are worried about the impact of prescription drug affordability boards on patients.

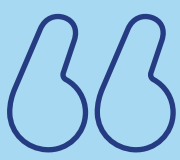
Here's what they have to say:




If affected patients' medical plans have essentially created a PDAB formulary, this will limit prescribing freedom and particularly be problematic in patients with limited options. 

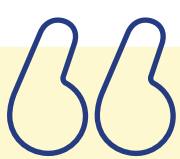
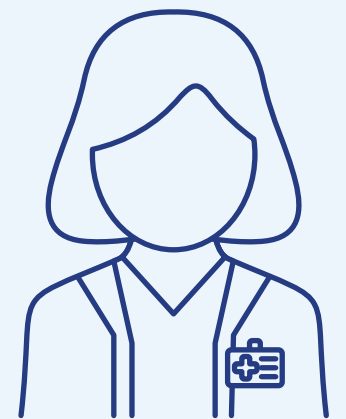

There are no benefits to PDABs. Decisions will be based on money, not on patient safety. 

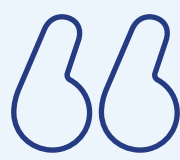
